Caring for your livestock with farm water supply infrastructure

Rebates up to
\$25 000
available

The *National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme* is provided in Western Australia by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation and offers rebates for purchase and installation of on-farm stock water infrastructure.

Rebates of up to \$25 000 are offered to commercial livestock farmers for stock water infrastructure on rural Western Australian properties vulnerable to periods of dry conditions and on-farm livestock water deficiencies.



About the rebates

If you are a commercial livestock farmer or pastoralist with a business experiencing or vulnerable to stock water deficiency, you may apply for a rebate under the *National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme*. Rebates are available toward costs associated with farm water infrastructure that addresses livestock welfare needs and improves resilience against water deficiency.

The rebate is 25% of the cost of purchase, delivery and, if applicable, the labour costs to engage a person to install water infrastructure for animal welfare needs. The maximum that can be claimed per farm business is \$25 000.

Water infrastructure purchased and installed after 30 June 2018 is eligible for this scheme.



Are you eligible?

If you answer **YES** to these questions, you may be eligible to apply for a rebate.

Are you

- a property owner, share farmer or lease holder in the livestock industry?
- a pastoralist or commercial farmer of sheep, beef, dairy and/or general livestock as defined by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation?
- registered for GST and do you have an active ABN?
- able to purchase and install new water infrastructure for **livestock welfare** and/or to improve resilience against livestock water deficiency, on property in **rural** Western Australia?
